Sometimes the Lord does tell us to wait and rest - just stop and see me acting! - **Exodus 14 v 13 - 14** - Moses answered the people "Do not be afraid, stand firm and you will see the deliverance the Lord will bring you today the Lord will fight for you; you need only to be still."

Then there is the waiting and acting! **Psalm 33 v 20 - 22** "We wait in hope for the Lord; he is our help and our shield. In him our hearts rejoice, for we trust in his holy name. May your unfailing love rest upon us, O Lord, even as we put our hope in you." Here we don't stop "waiting" but we **GO** in the strength of the Lord - we **wait** on God while we **act** in reliance on Him.


So, let's cultivate in our daily life and especially in the work of the church a

Miracles still Happen!

I am overwhelmed by God's amazing grace and mercy. On the 14th April, after waking up and getting ready for the day, I got a tightening and crushing feeling in the middle of my chest.

I called 999 and was taken to hospital. After doing some tests on me the doctors said that through the blood tests that I had had a bad heart attack.
 I texted lots of my friends and family and asked them to pray and straight
 away I felt this amazing peace.

Two days later I went for an angiogram and some other tests, they all came back clear. Despite of the results the doctors were convinced that something was wrong and insisted that I was put on some new medication. They sent me home and within two days I had two more heart attacks so went back to a different hospital. Again I asked everyone to pray and the peace was even more amazing. I was sent for more tests, two of which were C.T. scans, one for my heart and one for my lungs and again they came back clear. The conclusion was that I was very allergic to the Ramipril medication. The doctors stopped all new medication except the Aspirin. They are still baffled and convinced that the first chest pains was definitely a heart attack and yes I think they were right and what happened was a miracle and an answer to prayer. The other two were real but it was because of the medication, my body is exhausted but recovering nicely.

Thank you all for your faithful prayers and most of all thank you my awesome God and Father who listens to every prayer and still performs miracles!
