Sorry about that.. just paused to chat to a lad and his Mum who we've got to know here. He is a lovely young man and he came in with a fist-full of two pence coins that he was determined to put in the donation pot before helping mum with her shopping needs...

With regard to support

we've been so encouraged by the daily food donations from Sainsbury's and also locals who are placing items into our designated container at the supermarket.

Marlpit Farm shop regularly supplies us with apples, Emily, with a multitude of surplus milk, Kitchen of Kent with fruit and veg, Hubbard's lovely donations, Frankies, and then, other amazing private donations just keep arriving.

It is a privilege to be able to both reduce food wastage and find a home for food where it is most needed.

Our team has been brilliant in collecting food nightly from Sainsburys and also helping to log food in or to clean and check stock rotation.

Over the Christmas period we've been grateful that folk have kindly manned the church on the days the Community Fridge is open (whilst Maggie has been on her hols.)

Having a presence here has meant that there is always someone available to chat or provide help for Pantry visitors if they need us.

Sorry, more folk stopping for a shop and a chat. They really enjoyed some of the Pantry's Christmas goodies and the youngsters are having fun finding some tasty morsels to help their lovely Dad cook dinner.

He only works part time at present so he can help in their care.

As I was saying, it is such a privilege to be here, to get to know folk and have some real conversations.

### **Coffee Shop Opening**

The 6<sup>th</sup> January 2022 is currently scheduled to be the first day of opening for the new Shepherd's Pantry Coffee Shop at SFC. This is the fourth in the portfolio of new food and hospitality-based projects which was envisioned several months ago and will work alongside the Community Fridge, Hug-in-a-Box and the Pantry Parcels which are already up and running. The pandemic has highlighted to us all issues such as social isolation and financial hardship so the purpose of these projects is to find new, compassionate and relevant ways to engage with and support people in our community using the resources we have available or can leverage as a Church.

The Coffee shop will be open to everyone and is 'pop-up' in style rather than being open every day so the opening times are initially planned to be 12noon to 2pm on Thursday's and Saturday's. The intention is to create a welcoming and informal space for people to 'get refreshment' by enjoying great drinks, snacks and light lunches and to increase social connections and friendships. SFC has secured grant funding to cover the salary of a barista as the lead worker in the coffee shop and local person Charlotte Taylor has been appointed to this role. She will be supported by myself and hopefully other volunteers in time.

So do make a note in your diary when the coffee shop is open and come along and support and enjoy this new community facility!
