New Surface Cleaner

To consistently comply with food hygiene requirements, we have purchased a 'fast-acting', British Standards compliant surface cleaner called Jantex which is the **only** product that should **be used in the kitchen and servery areas and for table cleaning from now on.** You will see some new spray bottles around which are refillable and which should not be thrown away when empty. A 5 litre bottle of ready-to-use cleaner will live under the sink in the kitchen from which the spray bottles can be refilled. Thanks for your cooperation!



Creche/Tiddlers

During the morning service on Sundays, with the exception of Family Church weeks (first Sunday of the month) the various children's groups function. For school-aged children the groups run primarily to provide age-appropriate Bible teaching. The creche and Tiddlers group runs primarily to ensure that the parents of little ones are able to access the communion and teaching slots in the main hall without worrying about their children.

When the service runs to the usual format, all of the children will be in the main hall for the first 10 minutes or so and will then leave for their groups. At this point the preschool children will join the Treasure Seekers upstairs for some singing and will then go to their own room downstairs to play. This may include a Bible story and activity but we are flexible and led by the mood and interest of the children.

Currently we only have 3 volunteers to take this group and on some weeks may not be able to provide cover or may need additional assistance.

If you would like to join the team, we would love to have you. The position requires a DBS check, the ability to interact well with young children and possibly the ability to sit on the floor (!!). Please speak to Corinne for more information.

On Family Church weeks there are no groups organised for the children as the service is designed to be more interactive and all inclusive. If your child is fractious and uncomfortable, please feel free to take them out to the creche room, next to the main hall. If your child is fidgety but happy, please don't feel that you need to remove them from the service. We love to have them trotting around, shaking shakers and doing what children do.






