Growing Season

July is a month of growth. Gardens blossom, fields are full, and long evenings invite us to venture outdoors. See how sunflowers stretch toward the sun - confident, rooted, alive.

At SFC we are so grateful for all who have worked to make our church garden so beautiful. It is a wonderful place whether filled with children's laughter on a Thursday or a place of silence and prayer at other times – it is a delightful space to appreciate the beauty of our world and to see the growth in the grass, trees and shrubs.

All are welcome to enjoy our garden during our projects showcase and Garden Party on **Saturday 12th July from 12-2pm**. If you want to attend you must book a place by 6th July – for more details see page 4 & 6.

And as we move through this warmest part of the year, it's a chance to reflect on our own spiritual growth. Are we flourishing in our faith - or feeling a bit parched under the weight of the daily routine?

The Apostle Paul wrote to the Galatians about the kind of growth the Spirit brings:

"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." (Galatians 5:22–23)

It's a beautiful list - but not always an easy one to live out. Just as a garden needs care and attention - watering, pruning, weeding, grass cutting - so too does our inner life. Growth doesn't happen by accident. It takes personal commitment, time, and God's grace.

What might "spiritual gardening" look like this July?

1. Make space for God

The longer days offer natural pauses and spaces—morning light, evening stillness. Take a few minutes to read Scripture, sit in silence, or pray. You might use Psalm 1 as a guide, where the one who delights in God's Word is "like a tree planted by streams of water."

2. Look outwards

Summer often brings community events, fêtes, barbecues, garden parties, and more. These are simple but meaningful opportunities to share our life and faith with others. You don't need a platform or a plan - just a listening ear, a welcoming heart, and a readiness to love your neighbour.

Even small acts - offering a cold drink, extending an invitation, checking in on someone who may feel forgotten - can bear fruit. In these everyday interactions, we often meet Christ in the face of the stranger.

3. Trust the slow work of God

Not all growth is visible. Just as seeds germinate underground, God is often at work in ways we cannot see or measure. If you're in a season of waiting, or feeling spiritually dry, take heart. The farmer must plant then wait many months for harvest. The Lord is always faithful.

As it says in **James 5:7**:

"Be patient, therefore, beloved, until the coming of the Lord. The farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it..."

We are all growing "in season," even if our season is one of resting, healing, or simply holding on.

Whatever this month holds - whether it's full of activity or calm and quiet - may it be a time when you draw nearer to God, find joy in your community, and continue growing into the person God has called you to be.

A Prayer for July:

Lord of the harvest, In this season of warmth and life, Help me grow in grace, Bear fruit in love, And trust your work in me -Even when I cannot see it. Amen.

Don Elliott

We were saddened to hear of the death of Don Elliott recently, who died peacefully in his sleep on the 20th June. Don was a long standing member of SFC. Don also served as a church elder for a number of years, including the transition times of both the move back from the school to our current building and also of the transfer of church leadership from Clive Jones to Ryan Ahern as our church pastor.

Joan has kindly written a lovely tribute to Don of her memories and friendship with him below.

Our son Andrew came to live with us as he was very unwell. One Sunday he asked me to go to church with him. There, Ryan and Don realised straight away that he needed their support and love. Don became like a second father to Andrew, becoming part of our extended family. We shared his love of sport and gardening. In July 2014 Andrew was the first person to be baptised since the Free Church's rebuild, but outside in the garden in a paddling pool as the baptistry had not yet been completed. Of course, Don was with Andrew as his supporter. Having been helped to reduce his problems, Andrew returned to his home near Canterbury and in 2019 married Hannah. Don was a delighted invited guest. Ever since, whenever they visited Staplehurst, they visited Don, enjoying that close bond that the years had cemented.

I too became very close to Don at the Wednesday Prayer meetings, especially when some of us shared lunch together afterwards. One morning, when it was his turn to lead the meeting, Don talked about baptism and I felt that God was telling me to obey this and so I was baptised in 2016.

Don was a very special and caring man. His gentle kindness shone a strong light as he exemplified Jesus' instructions in Matthew 5 v16, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

Having recently moved into the village, June and John Izbicki walked into a meeting of Staplehurst Interest Group in 2015 and a great friendship was formed. They met at a dinner party and married in 1986, living in London and Paris for a few years. June had a young son and daughter and John a son from previous marriages.

John sadly had a stroke just before Covid struck and spent many months in a local

care home. June found the friends they had made at Interest Group very supportive and attended almost every week after our re-start in the Free Church. June felt the warm welcome of members of the church and attended Sunday services. She also really enjoyed the fellowship of being a member of Clive and Lynne's Home Group.



Week 1 (1st July to 6th July) - Theme: Rest in God's Presence

Pause:

Lord, in the stillness of this moment, I slow down and breathe deeply.

Rejoice:

Thank You for the gift of rest and rhythm.

You are my refuge and strength, my place of safety and peace in a noisy world.

Ask:

Restore my soul where it is weary. Give wisdom to all who feel burdened or overworked.

Yield:

I lay down my striving and hurry.

Week 4 (21st July to 27th July)

Theme: Walking in the Spirit

Pause:

Lord, I take this moment to be still.

Let my thoughts settle and my heart be open. Come, Holy Spirit lead in me again.

Rejoice:

Thank You for the gift of Your Holy Spirit.

You guide, comfort, and empower me. In You I live and move and have my being.

Ask:

Fill me afresh today.

Help me to live not by my own strength, but by Yours. Guide my words, my actions, and my choices.

Yield:

I surrender control.

Holy Spirit, have Your way in my life, in every step, every conversation, every breath.

Week 5 (28th July to 31st July) - Theme: Gratitude and New Beginnings

Pause:

As this month draws to a close, I pause to reflect.

Thank You for carrying me through each day. I acknowledge Your hand in all things.

Rejoice:

You are the God of new mercies, every morning.

Thank You for the joys, lessons, and even the struggles of July. You are good, Your love endures forever.

Ask:

Prepare my heart for the month ahead.

Give me eyes to see where You're working. Bless those I will meet and guide my thoughts and actions.

Yield:

I place the coming days into Your hands.

I will trust and not be afraid. Let Your will be done in me, through me, and around me.
