

Dear Friends,

As we enter October we traditionally think about Harvest, although depending on the crop harvest has been going on for well over five months from June strawberries and will continue through October with grapes and potatoes!

Even in Staplehurst the effects of climate change and global markets affect the crops we see growing around us. Thirty years ago, we would have seen a lot more hops being grown and a lot more apples and pears. Many of those fields are now turned over to grapes and by all accounts this year looks set to break all records with a bumper harvest. English wine is growing in reputation and popularity and the jobs it creates are a major contributor to our local economy.

As any farmer or farm worker will tell you getting a good crop doesn't just happen. A lot of planning goes into selecting the right crop for the right land, preparing the soil and planting at the right time. The crop then needs to be nurtured. Growth is encouraged through pruning, watering and if necessary, pest control. All before the need to harvest and then store the crop to maximise what can be sold. Once the harvest is gathered in the farmer will then think about whether to plant a follow-on crop or what needs to be done to the ground to prepare it for next year's cycle of planting and harvesting. Is more drainage required? Was the ground too dry? How did the wind affect the crop? Was the yield what was expected – was it lower or higher? What budget is there to make any of the desired changes?

Christians believe that we are formed in God's image and that care of the land, animals and the world around us reflects how God sees and cares for us. Each of us are unique, special, individuals who should be shown consideration and respect whatever our background or circumstances. We also believe that despite what the world may say about individualism, humans are designed to be part of communities, to support one another, to care for one another, to help one another grow in faith and love. Just as the farmer plans and thinks about every aspect of his farmland, Chrisitan's believe that we have a heavenly father who cares about every aspect of our lives. He wants the best for us, and he gives us free will, to make our own choices.

At Staplehurst Free Church much of what we do each week is around our choice to serve God through serving our community, be that through Free Bees, Warm Room, Community Fridge, Badminton, Interest Group, Friends together, Debt Advice, Care Home Visits, Youth 24, House groups or our Sunday services.

Whichever way you choose to spend October I hope that it will help you reflect on our amazing planet, a world of opportunity and potential, filled with people just like you that need love, respect and dignity. Many of us may face challenges due to health, or finances, or grief or relationships – but those challenges are better faced with support from others. With a church supporting us and a Heavenly Father who loves us we can achieve wonderful things, we can build a vibrant community of hope.

Why are we having a Church Gift Day?

On Sunday 19th October we are holding a Church Gift Day – a chance to give towards projects that will strengthen our church's life and mission. The Lord has blessed our finances this year but there is always more that we want to do as a church.

In the next few months, we will need resources for the following expenditure:

A new automated front door – welcoming, secure and safe, that will also reduce drafts.

A replacement lift – ensuring full accessibility to our upper floor once again.

Resources for Treasure Seekers & Free Bees – helping children grow in faith.

Support for Youth24 – encouraging our young people.

Getting the resources to run "The Bible Course" – the new course from the Bible society introducing what the Bible is and why it is relevant to each of us.

Following the sudden closure of Spurgeon's College, Peter has enrolled with Westminster Theological College – we need to invest in theological training to equip leaders for effective gospel ministry.

Projects in development that we would like to start in 2026:

A Parish Nursing pilot in conjunction with the medical practice in Staplehurst

A digital literacy group helping people with phones, tablets and technology in general

A "chairobics" group to help us keep all active as we age and possibly an second group without chairs for people who want more!

Eight Areas for Prayer in the month of October

As Christians we believe that our God is a God of abundance, not scarcity - he blesses his people and holds nothing back. He saw that his creation was good and takes delight in our happiness. Let the Holy Spirit guide you and pray that God's will be done as it is in heaven in the following areas:

1. Economic hardship & cost of living in the UK

- UK retail sales have fallen for many months, reflecting weak consumer demand and financial pressures.
- Rising costs, inflation, energy bills pray for those under financial strain: low-income families, the unemployed, pensioners.
- Pray for wise and just leadership in government making decisions that affect the most vulnerable.
- Pray for families affected by growing levels of child poverty, for policies to protect children, and for churches/charities working in relief.
- Pray for fair working conditions, for those unemployed who are seeking work, for those working in difficult, low-pay, or insecure jobs.
- Pray for the work of Green Pastures helping people out of homelessness into supported living.
- Pray for the work of our debt advisors encourage them as they support people struggling with the burden of debt.

2. Health: mental, workforce well-being, public health

- There is a growing concern in business and society about workforce health, mental health, and people leaving work due to health issues.
- Pray for the NHS, mental health support services, and for pastoral care to have wisdom to support people in the right way.

3. Social regeneration & community cohesion

- Over the summer there have been many protests and counter protests, we've had flags and roundabouts painted - pray for community cohesion - for neighbours to get on with each other and seek the common good.
- Pray for areas that are in need of investment and regeneration: that initiatives reach and help those in need, that projects are inclusive and build healthy community life.

4. Prayer for migrants, migration policy, human rights

• Pray for compassion, justice, wisdom and fairness in migration policy; that genuine migrants and refugees would find safety and acceptance; for Christians to represent Christ in how they respond.

5. Environmental care & climate concerns

Pray for our rivers and seas, that our water companies would put environmental protection ahead
of profit, for sustainable practices, and for the church's witness in creation care.

6. Prisons, justice, human dignity

- Pray for all those working to take the gospel into prisons encourage and protect them.
- Pray for the rehabilitation of offenders that they might make a success of their release and not return to crime.

7. Food, hunger, international aid, peace

- Pray for the work of Tear Fund and its partner churches throughout the world. Pray that relief work and capacity building work is impactful and supports those in need.
- Pray for food security globally, for local hunger issues, for charities and agencies tackling food poverty.
- We pray for peace in Gaza, Israel and the West Bank. We pray for peace in Ukraine. Protect the work of Hope Lebedyn and Tear Fund in these places.

8. For our own church

- We pray for those we know who are sick or suffering.
- We pray for unity, holiness, courage in sharing the Gospel. For continued spiritual renewal.
- For activity leaders, volunteers and trustees for strength, discernment and wisdom.
- That we will continue to be a Bible and prayer focussed fellowship, welcoming to others, being the hands and feet of Jesus in or community.
- We pray for the success of Emily Owen's visit for the ladies' breakfast and our Family Service on the 11th & 12th October.
- We pray for the success of our gift day on the 19th October.

Proposed changes to Maidstone Borough Council

Government ministers want councils in Kent and Medway to deliver the services they provide in a different way. In the biggest shake up of local government in almost 50 years, they want to merge councils across the historic county of Kent to create a number of unitary councils serving roughly 500,000 people each.

This is known as Local Government Reorganisation, or LGR for short.

To enable the council to do this in the best interests of the residence they really want to know what's important to you when they think about setting up the new councils.

It would help the council if everyone would contribute their thoughts by filling in their short survey using the link below before 9am on Monday 6th October 2025.


